Proceedings of Executive Committee / General Body Meeting of Online XXXIX Annual Conference of Indian Association of Veterinary Pathologists and XIII Annual Meeting of Indian College of Veterinary Pathologists and International Symposium on "Global Challenges in Rapid Diagnosis and Management of Animal and Poultry Diseases for Improved Health and Productivity" held w.e.f. 17 - 20th November, 2022 at Department of Veterinary Pathology, College of Veterinary and Animal Science, Rajendranagar, PVNRTVU, Hyderabad, Telangana

The Executive Committee / General Body Meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Dr B.N. Tripathi, President, IAVP on 16 and 17th November, 2022, respectively. The meeting was attended by Vice Presidents, Secretary General, Treasurer, Chief Editor, Zonal Secretaries and EC Members / Life Members. Secretary General Dr K.P. Singh welcomed all office bearers and EC/GB members. President, IAVP, Dr B.N. Tripathi gave opening remarks and appreciated the efforts of office bearers and in particular Dr K.P. Singh, Secretary General and Dr M.R. Reddy, Chief Editor of IJVP.

- 1. He emphasized that the needful should be done to improve the rating of the journal and to include it in the Thomson Reuters Impact factor and even seek professional assistance from recognized agencies.
- 2. Members should be encouraged to submit a large number of quality research papers to improve the standard of the Indian Journal of Veterinary Pathology (IJVP).
- 3. He also emphasized to publish 01 review article in each issue of the journal to enhance the citation of the journal.
- 4. Invitations should be made to the eminent Scientists and Professors of various Veterinary Colleges / Universities of the country and Indian alumni working abroad to submit the quality research papers.
- 5. The matter of slight amendment in the constitution regarding time period of disciplinary action against any IAVP life member was discussed. It was decided that 3-5 years period of disciplinary action is appropriate depending upon the nature of the indiscipline by any member.
- 6. The Veterinary Pathologists should be encouraged for appearing in the ICVP Diplomate examination.
- 7. The possibility of recognition of ICVP Diplomate by VCI may be explored.

Agenda No. 1: Approval of the minutes of the proceedings of last IAVP meeting held at Bikaner

- 1. The Secretary General informed the members about the action taken report (ATR) based on the Proceedings of 38th IAVP Conference, 2021 held on virtual mode at RAJUVAS, Bikaner, Rajasthan.
- 2. The Proceedings have been circulated among the EC members and all members agreed with the same.
- 3. The approval of minutes of the 38th Proceedings of IAVP held at Bikaner was proposed by Dr M. Saminathan and seconded by Dr A. Anand Kumar. The minutes were approved by EC/GB, respectively.

Agenda No. 2: Report by the Secretary General

- 1. New Life Members: A total of 35 new Veterinary Pathologists joined as Life Member of IAVP.
- 2. **Zonal Activities:** The newly elected zonal secretaries may strengthen the zonal activities of the Association by organizing the webinars with more active participation of the members.
- 3. **Database Updating:** Updation of the addresses of the Life Members of the IAVP was discussed and Committee members (Drs N.K. Gangwar, T.K. Rajkhowa, Manjunatha S.S., Manisha Mehra and R.C. Ghosh) were requested to complete the work at the earliest.

Agenda No. 3: Report of the Chief Editor

Dr M.R. Reddy, Chief Editor, IJVP, briefed the house, about the IJVP report and informed that:

- 1. The NAAS rating of IJVP has increased from 5.4 to 5.54.
- 2. The acceptance and rejection rate of the articles were 74.74 and 25.26%, respectively.
- 3. During 2021-22, a total of 62 articles were received for publication in the IJVP, one review article is being included in each issue of the Journal.
