(1) Proceedings of General Body Meeting of Indian Association of Veterinary Pathologists (IAVP) held at Veterinary College, Bengaluru, on 11th November, 2017

The Executive Committee meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Dr R. Somvanshi, President, IAVP on 8th November, 2017 at 05:00 PM in the Committee Room of Karnataka Veterinary Council, Hebbal, Bengaluru, Karnataka, a day prior to the Annual Conference of IAVP to be held at Veterinary College, Hebbal, Bengaluru, Karnataka on 09-11th November, 2017. The meeting was attended by Vice President, Secretary General, Treasurer, Editors, Zonal Secretaries, most the EC members and Organizing Secretary Dr H.D. Narayana Swamy. The meeting was conducted by the Secretary General, Dr K.P. Singh.

The President and Secretary General briefed the Executive Committee members about activities carried out during the previous year. The Secretary General informed the members about the action taken report (ATR) based on the Proceedings of 34th IAVP Conference, 2016 held at Durg, Chhattisgarh. The Executive Committee and General Body condoled the demise of all eminent Veterinary Pathologists passed away during the year 2016-17 by keeping 2 minute silence. Executive Committee congratulated former IAVP President Dr J.L. Vegad and Vice President Dr C. Balachandran for receiving the prestigious lifetime achievement award of Composite Livestock Feed Manufacturer Association (CLFMA) and Tamilnadu State Council for Science and Technology (TANSA), respectively. IAVP wished them for more recognition and laurels in future too. IAVP supported ICVP for organization of Special Technical Session on Case Presentation in forth coming Conference.

Presidents Remark

- 1. Dr R. Somvanshi, President desired that the some of the office bearers and EC members of the association should be more active and respond/express their views to EC mails.
- 2. President appreciated the efforts made by Chief Editor and his team for up gradation of the Indian Journal of Veterinary Pathology (IJVP) and mentioned that there has been progressive improvement in the quality of the journal.
- 3. President once again thanked Dr R.C. Ghosh, Organizing Secretary of 34th IAVP Conference for its organization in befitting manner in 2016 at Durg, Chhattisgarh.

Secretary's Report:

- 1. Secretary General of the association presented the report and apprised the Executive Committee about various activities of the association carried out at head quarter as well as by different zones.
- 2. Total life member of the association on date were 1,305 including 30 new admitted members during the year.
- 3. He informed that The Lesion, 2017 (Volume, 7th, 1&2, 12 page) was published for distribution to the life-members of IAVP during the conference.
- 4. Around 33 special mementoes of 3 categories, 150 quality award certificates (for all awardees) and 3 Fellowship citations were fabricated/ printed and will be distributed in conference.
- 5. It was informed that with the help of M/S IT Code Solutions, Bareilly, IAVP Website was redesigned, illustrated and continuously updated. Now it is having photographs of all former IAVP Presidents, Secretaries, some office bearers and IAVP Fellows. On home

page, live running pictures are depicting gross and microscopic lesions and major events of the year. Website is continuously updated with new postings of awards, professional news and obituaries. President informed that Phase II activity will continue for further improvements of website.

- 6. One new IAVP- Prof. P.K.R. Iyer Memorial Best M.V.Sc Thesis Award in the honor of late Prof. P.K.R. Iyer was proposed and approved by the Executive Committee/ General Body. This award was sponsored by family members of Prof. Iyer (Mr. Kumar, Lt. Gen. P.R. Venkatesh, and Mrs Chitra) and his students (Drs U. Sengupta, A.T. Rao, Lal Krishna, R.K.S Dogra, K.N. Gowal, R. Somvanshi, G.S. Pandey, K.C. Varshney, T. Rahman and G. Saikumar) and admirer (Dr C. Balachandran) by donating Rs 1.00 lakh.
- 7. In honor of eminent Veterinary Pathologists and stalwarts of IAVP who passed away during the year 2016-17, a **Special Memorial Lecture Session** was planned to be conducted at ASVP Congress at Bengaluru. EC/GB approved this proposal.

Decisions taken by EC/GB:

- 1. It was decided to prepare/publish a documentation entitled **IAVP at a Glance** of the association on- history, constitution and achievements of IAVP, past office bearers, conferences, fellows, awards and awardees and zonal activities. For this, a four committee was constituted namely Dr R. Somvanshi (Chairman), Dr M.C. Prasad (Member) Dr C. Balachandran (Member) and Dr Vidya Singh (Member).
- 2. The logo of the association prepared about 40 years ago and needs improvement with inclusion of microscope and more clarity in its depiction.
- 3. The old IAVP issues (1976-2007) need to be scanned and uploaded on the IAVP website.
- 4. Executive Committee felt the need for strengthening of Zonal activities with targeted goals especially in North-East Zone.
- 5. Reactivation and/ or creation of local IAVP chapters and strengthening the activities of different zones were also considered. The expert lectures will be arranged in selective zones with genuine financial support from central unit and these events will be organized by Zonal Secretary.
- 6. On the line of IJVP Awards, the IAVP-Specialist Pathology Award evaluation process will be initiated approx. 6 month before the commencement of the annual conference. For this applications will be invited in advance. This will reduce work pressure on IAVP Secretariat at conference venue.
- 7. General Body approved that in future, there will be **No Entry Fee for IAVP Awards** except **Specialist Awards (Rs 500.00) and Fellowship (Rs 1000.00)** which will be valid for continuous three years.
- 8. It was proposed to revive earlier constituted **IAVP Award Review Committee** for considering possibilities of initiating IAVP-Best Teacher Award, IAVP-Best Women Pathologist Award without increasing number of IAVP Awards. The committee may also review and consider the merging of Wildlife and Laboratory Animal Pathologist and Farm Animal and Companion Animal Awards as sufficient quality applications are not received. For this, earlier constituted committee is revived (Drs. A.K. Sharma, Chairman, D.V. Joshi, Member, R.V.S. Pawaiya, Member. Special Invitee-R. Somvanshi). Committee is requested to examine the matter and give its recommendation in 45 days.
- 9. To establish direct communication link with its life members, it was decided to create **IAVP Facebook Group (Only Veterinary Pathology)**. In this, group discussion on case diagnosis, professional news including appointments, promotions, retirements, demises, conference information etc. will be allowed.
- 10. For establishing the smooth contacts with colleges/ universities, it was decided to prepare a list of Professors and Heads, Department of Veterinary Pathology of Veterinary

Colleges/Universities/Institutions along with their contact details, This information will be uploaded on IAVP website.

Chief Editors (IJVP) Report:

During the year 2017, The Indian Journal of Veterinary Pathology (IJVP) was published timely on quarterly basis. The efforts of Chief Editor for quality and timely publication of the journal were appreciated by the house. September issue published **Guest Editorial** on topic **The future of veterinary diagnostic pathology by Prof. Matti Kiupel**, Department of Pathobiology and Diagnostic Investigation, Diagnostic Center for Population and Animal Health, MSU, USA. It had a special cover page in honour of Founder Editor late Prof. P.K.R. Iyer. The NAAS impact factor of the journal is **5.48** (NAAS 2017).

Treasurers Report:

Total 1305 life members as on date including 30 newly admitted life members during 2017. Treasurer informed that Dr S.K. Panda, Organizing Secretary of 30th IAVP Conference Bhubaneshwar, 2013 has cleared all the dues. As per audit report 2016-17, total income was Rs. 9,42,610/- and expenditure was Rs. 6,70,515/-. Total saving was Rs. 2,72,095/- during the year under report. Organizing Secretary, Asian Veterinary Pathology Congress, 2017 should make payment of 20% of registration fees to Treasurer, Central Unit, IAVP; besides refunding Rs 50,000/- seed money paid to him by IAVP at the earliest.

IAVP Conference 2018:

Dr C.K. Singh Professor and Head, Department of Veterinary Pathology, College of Veterinary Sciences, GADVASU, Ludhiana proposed in General Body meeting to organize 35th IAVP Congress at GADVASU, Ludhiana in 2018. Later due to some administrative policy of GADVASU, proposal was not matured. Then interested Professor and Heads, Department of Veterinary Pathology, College of Veterinary Sciences were requested to come with proposals to Organize IAVP Congress in 2018. Dr D.V. Joshi, Principal, Veterinary College, S.K. Nagar, Dantiwada, Gujarat, came forward to organize 35th IAVP Conference, 2018 at SK Nagar, Gujarat under secretary ship of Professor B.J. Patel, Head, Department of Veterinary Pathology. This proposal was unanimously accepted and an invitation was extended to SDAU.
