The Constitution of Indian College of Veterinary Pathologists : A Historic Milestone of IAVP

(A Certification Body for Veterinary Pathologists in India)

The Indian Association of Veterinary Pathologists has developed a certification system for veterinary pathologists in India. The certification body, called as the Indian College of Veterinary Pathologists (ICVP) is expected to function in a fashion similar to the personal certification systems for veterinary pathologists in the United States of America (American College of Veterinary Pathologists) and Europe (European College of Veterinary Pathologists). The membership to the College is open only to certified veterinary pathologists i.e. the pathologists who successfully complete an examination of the ICVP on par with those existing in the USA (ACVP) and Europe (ECVP). The College has already established liaison with overseas colleagues and its founding examination was conducted under the supervision of Dr Paul Stromberg, a Diplomate of ACVP and the Past President of ACVP for identifying Diplomates of the College in India. Sixteen candidates qualified for certification and designated as Diplomate of ICVP. These Diplomates shall be responsible to supervise future potential Diplomates to take-up the ICVP examination.

The Indian College of Veterinary Pathologists is pioneered and conceived by a group of twenty-two life members of the Indian Association of Veterinary Pathologists, who have established a recognisable stature in academia, research, industry and practice, identified as Charter Members. In view of globalisation and the potential for India to become a hub for human resources in science and technology (HRST: as perceived by the UN), this venture has lot of importance. It is certainly a model to follow for other disciplines under the veterinary and animal sciences so as to elevate the quality of professional competence in India. The current headquarters of the certification body is the Division of Pathology, Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Izatnagar. The certification system could be put in place as a result of tireless efforts of the certification committee during the last three years led by Dr. Lal Krishna with distinguished members as Dr. R.N.S. Gowda, Dr. R.S. Chauhan, Dr. V.K. Gupta and Dr. T.V. Anilkumar.

First ICVP Executive Committee Constituted

The election to the first Regular Executive Committee of Indian Society for Certification of Veterinary Pathologists (ICVP) was constituted by unanimous decision of the general body and other officebearers for a period of two years i.e. 2009-2010 and shall assume the charge with immediate effect.

It was also decided to activate the local and regional chapters of IAVP, and to organize more such meetings in future for the benefit of veterinary pathologists in particular, and veterinary profession in general. Silver Jubilee Annual Conference of IAVP, International Symposium and Satellite Seminar Organized at IVRI, Izatnagar

The Indian Association of Veterinary Pathologists organized its Silver Jubilee Annual Conference and International Symposium on "Quality Assurance in Pathology and Disease Diagnosis" and a Satellite Seminar on Descriptive Gross and Microscopic Veterinary Pathology in Necropsy, Biopsy and Certification Examination (sponsored by CL Davis Foundation, USA) during 10-12 November 2008 at Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Izatnagar, UP. In the symposium, more then 200 eminent veterinary pathologists, scientists, and veterinarians from all over the country and USA attended the conference. The satellite seminar was

held on 10 November, 2008 followed by inauguration of the conference. The chief guest of the function was Professor Paul C. Stromberg and the guest of honor was Mr. T. Venkatesh, Principal Advisor, QCI, New Delhi. Other dignitaries present on the dias were Dr Lal Krishna, President IAVP, Dr R.S. Chauhan, the Chairman of the conference, Dr V. K. Gupta, the Secretary General of IAVP and Dr Rajendra Singh, the Organizing Secretary of the conference. In the symposium, the concept of quality assurance was dealt with in 8 technical sessions involving topics on different aspects of animal diseases. The satellite seminar was delivered by an eminent veterinary pathologist Professor Paul C. Stromberg, Department of Veterinary Biosciences, Ohio State University, USA.



National Seminar-cum-Workshop on "Mycotoxisis" organized at IVRI, Izatnagar

A National Seminar-cum-Workshop on " Current Status, Diagnosis and Management of Mycotoxisis in Livestock and Poultry" was held during July 10-11, 2008 in the Division of Pathology, I. V. R. I., Izatnagar to commemorate the superannuation of Dr. P. Dwivedi, who had immensely contributed in this field. Seminar was jointly sponsored by Dr. C.M. Singh Endowment Trust, Bareilly, Indian Association of Veterinary Pathologists (IAVP), Izatnagar Chapter and I.V.R.I., Izatnagar. Dr. R. Somvanshi, Head, Division of Pathology and Dr. A.K. Sharma, Principal Scientist were the chairman and organizing secretary of the seminar, respectively. Dr. R.B. Singh, former Director, Indian Agricultural Research Institute, Pusa, New Delhi inaugurated the Seminar and Dr. S.P.S. Ahlawat, Director, I.V.R.I., Izatnagar, presided over the function. More than 100 delegates working in the field of mycotoxicosis from all over the country participated and presented their work in various technical sessions. The Seminar was partially financed by Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

Meeting of Kerala Chapter of IAVP and a State level Seminar held at Kerala State Veterinary Council, Trivandrum

The programme was organised in two sessions. Dr. N. Vijayan, Professor of Pathology, COVAS, Mannuthy presided the morning-session. Prof. M. Krishnan Nair, former Dean and Director of Veterinary Education and Research (KAU) made an inspiring presentation on 'Molecular Oncology'. Technical Note

Glandular choristoma in the mesenteric lymph node of a goat

A cross-bred adult goat had fair body condition without diarrhoea. On examination post-slaughter, distal small intestinal mucosa was thickened and ileocaecal and mesenteric lymph nodes were enlarged. In one of the anterior mesenteric lymph node, cut surfaces showed a few gravish-white foci. Scrapping smears from ileocaecal valve and mesenteric lymph nodes (MLN) failed to reveal acid-fast bacilli. On histological examination, intestinal villi were thickened due to infiltration of greater number of lymphocytes and macrophages. Aggregates of macrophages were occasionally observed in the lamina propria. There was no evidence of any malignant changes in the villous or crypt epithelium or in the Peyer's patches. The samples were negative for bacterial culture but were positive by IS900 PCR for M.a.paratuberculosis (MAP). In the mesenteric lymph node, intestinal crypts (intestinal glands) like structures at 3 to 4 places were observed in the subcapsular region or little down in the cortical region (fig.). These glandular structures were lined by columnar epithelium interspersed with goblet cells having vacuolated cytoplasm without cellular atypia, and stained positively for periodic acid Schiff's stain. This is the second report of choristoma in a caprine lymph node, formed by glandular clusters whose phenotype was consistent with intestinal epithelium. The mechanism underlying the development of these inclusions is unclear, but possibilities include involvement of a non-specific factor, inflammation or an inductive substance, sloughing of the epithelium, or haematogenic or lymphatic dissemination. The case reported here was most probably associated with a regional inflammatory process as a result of MAP infection. Incidentally, the first case of glandular choristoma reported in a goat in the literature was also associated with MAP infection.
